機構簡介

勵·緬在 2015 年初由一班對緬甸兒童、教育及慈善工作有負擔，且曾去過當地探訪、服務的朋友所組成。在各方努力下，本會在 2015 年 12 月獲得香港特別行政區政府稅務局批准，根據《稅務條例》第 88 條成為獲豁免繳稅的慈善機構。

故此，本會在 2016 年正式以慈善機構的名義在香港及緬甸推動不同的籌款及關懷行動，讓香港，以至世界不同地方的社群都能透過不同方式關心緬甸的兒童、教育及社會福利事宜，秉承本會的創會宗旨：

Love for Myanmar (送愛到緬甸)

Learn from Myanmar (從緬甸學習)

Link to Myanmar (與緬甸連繫)

本會於成立時便繼承了中華基督教會沙田堂自 2010 年在該堂開展的「緬甸兒童助養計劃」，持續與合作機構「恩慈之家」攜手關心緬甸的孤兒及貧困家庭兒童。此外，機構在香港和緬甸的各項工作都獲得多方肯定，近年多間本港大專院校邀請本會到校內分享，以及委託承辦交流團；香港特別行政區政府民政事務局與青年發展委員會的「國際青年交流資助計劃」亦連續兩年贊助本會舉辦緬甸服務交流團。



前言

過往一年，相信我們每一位都渡過了不平凡的一年，緬甸的民眾更加處於水深火熱中。新冠病毒疫情在 2020 年雖未有在緬甸肆虐，但全球旅遊與空運停頓，讓當地經濟大受打擊，我們亦無法如往時一樣派出義工或舉辦服務團。踏入 2021 年緬甸更是雪上加霜，軍隊政變推翻民選政府，國內動盪持續不斷，人民日常的生活可說是遭逢巨變，就連我們日常與合作伙伴的網上聯繫、匯款等也受到影響。

雖然如此，我們並沒有停下來，也沒有放棄支援緬甸的教育和社區需要。縱然一些以往的工作無法有效開展，但本會藉此契機，聯合了更多有心、願意出錢出力的捐款人、機構和義工，在這艱難的時刻發揮創意，開始了以往從未做過的網上教學，並籌集款項為多個學生中心購置電腦，使緬甸的兒童能做到停課不停學。

為更有效運用資源，董事會於 2020 年決定停止運作了四年的「緬甸大學生獎學金計劃」，去年度的得獎同學都是畢業班或已被通知獎學金只會頒發一年。

疫情與政變雖阻礙了兩地的正常往來，卻造就了更多香港年輕大學生可以透過網上教學服務緬甸兒童，認識當地需要，這從來不是我們想像過的。我們想在此感謝每一位助養者、捐款人和義工，多謝你們在緬甸最有需要的時候與我們同行，希望在未來一年我們繼續不忘初心，不論宗教、族群、膚色、語言，持續關心緬甸不同社群的需要。

全年活動一覽

全年

緬甸兒童助養計劃

「緬甸兒童助養計劃」最初於 2010 年在中華基督教會沙田堂開展，2016 年起由本會繼承，以助養方式每月支持緬甸恩慈之家孤兒院及不同合作伙伴的學生中心兒童及青少年。

截至 2021 年 6 月，共有 128 位助養者每月支持 137 位來自恩慈之家轄下在仰光、臘戍、美航、公卡、苗族中心、象海的學生中心，以及欽邦 Khuahrang Village 及瑙坵恩信學校和學生中心的寄宿兒童及青少年，每月支持金額為港幣 265 元或每年港幣 3,000 元，支持的兒童人數與去年相同。

助養者現時可選擇以信用卡作每月自動轉帳捐款安排或一次過給予全年的助養捐款。

今年度鑑於疫情，緬甸與香港的空運中斷，故此本會改為透過網上形式將助養兒童的信件發送給每一位助養者，並邀請他們為助養孩子送上聖誕祝福和問候。



「緬甸兒童助養計劃」的合作伙伴「恩慈之家」由查天儒牧師及張茂蘭師母於 1991 年在緬甸北部城市臘戍創立，初期只是一幢房子，經過二十多年來不斷的擴展，現已照顧逾千名遍佈緬甸各城鄉，不同種族的孤兒，或家庭無能力照顧的孩子，負責他們的衣食住行、上學、書簿與醫療等費用。

購買電腦及網上教學

緬甸疫情自 2020 年中起不斷反覆，中、小學在 6 月新學期開學後間斷停課，不同學生中心及合作伙伴的兒童及青少年都面對學習停頓的難題。故此本會在 2020 年底開始發起籌募活動，最終為不同單位購買了 22 部電腦及為部份單位申請網上教學平台 Zoom 戶口。22 部電腦的受惠單位包括：

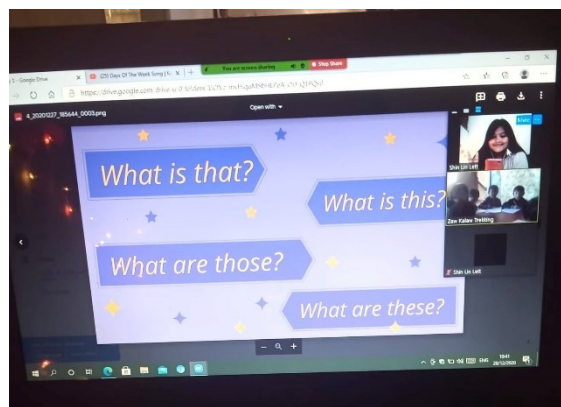
- 臘戍恩慈之家——7 部手提電腦
- 仰光 Lighthouse ——2 部桌上電腦
- 緬北基督教學院——10 部桌上電腦
- 撣邦南部 Thazi 學生中心——2 部桌上電腦
- 仰光 Mercy 學生中心——1 部手提電腦

自 2021 年 1 月起，本會與多間本港大專院校合作，院校定期安排同學為仰光、臘戍及欽邦的兒童提供網上英文課。雖然教學只能透過 Zoom 平台進行，每次也是短短一小時，但當地小朋友都很用心地上課及抄寫筆記。除了本港大專院校的同學，本會也組織曾前往緬甸的義工及緬甸獎學金得主擔任義務導師，為恩慈之家及撣邦南部 Kalaw 偏遠鄉村 Kanbani Village 的孩子教授英語。

合作的本港大專院校包括：

- 香港理工大學專業及持續教育學院
- 香港浸會大學

因應緬甸在 2021 年 7 月再次爆發大規模疫情，我們預計網上教學活動仍會持續一段時間。

疫情支援

因應緬甸的疫情於 2021 年中轉趨嚴重，本會特意向仰光社會企業 Pann Nann Ein 訂購由殘疾人士製作的布口罩，並送贈偏遠的欽邦兒童。



社區發展及人道援助項目

- ✎ **【學校擴建籌款】**在緬甸撣邦隆邱（Naunghkio）的恩信學校是我們所支持的合作伙伴，除了助養計劃，我們也帶過香港的大學生義工到當地參與服務。學校於 2020 年底因學生增多而需要擴建教室，但面臨經費不足，本會支持部份建築經費，讓當地逃避戰亂的孩子能有更好的學習空間。
- ✎ **【寄送衣物】**2021 年初適值有廠家捐出一批全新的舊版校服及體育服，我們決定將一部份透過船運寄送到緬甸偏鄉，包括東枝、欽邦及若開邦的村落、學生中心及難民營。所有寄送的衣服共重約 110 公斤，已於 4 月抵達緬甸，並由當地義工協助分發。



- ✎ **【支援若開邦 IDP】**緬甸若開邦因疫情及內戰，各地陸續出現留離失所的家庭（IDP，Internally Displaced People）。本會的合作夥伴在若開邦 Mimbya 一個營地協助在該處棲身的 33 個家庭，因部份家庭已沒有任何糧食，本會已多次購買糧油米食給他們，以解燃眉之急。
- ✎ **【重建學校屋頂及修建洗手間】**位於克倫邦 Kawkareik 鎮的學校，由於被大風吹毀屋頂，急需重建；同時因內戰令該鎮學校就學人數急升，學校的洗手間不敷應用，本會決定撥款資助該校重建屋頂及修建洗手間。

本會不時獲邀到不同機構或聚會進行分享及籌募活動，或媒體邀請進行訪問，以期讓大眾對緬甸的最新情況有更多的了解，以及本會在緬甸的工作。

- ☞ 【在家看世界】本會在 2020 年 10 月獲香港理工大學專業及持續教育學院學生事務處的邀請，透過網上平台分享「理想的失落與教育危機——緬甸」，與該校學生一起「在家看世界」，了解緬甸的教育現況。
- ☞ 【特義公民行動】2021 年 1 月獲義遊 Voltra 邀請我們參與賽馬會特義公民行動(社創培育－國際篇)，與香港及來自世界各地的青年在線上分享勵·緬多年來在緬甸的工作，特別是疫情後的參與。
- ☞ 【網台分享】網台讀癮發作於 2021 年 3 月邀請本會在他們的網台分享多年來在緬甸的慈善工作，亦有談及最近緬甸抗爭的觀察。

會務行政

周年會員大會

按照會章要求，本會於 2020 年 8 月 8 日舉行周年會員大會，確認陳文軒先生、江偉軒先生及江樹棠先生繼續擔任本會董事，李穎敏小姐為義務司庫，陳淑彥小姐為義務秘書，直至下次周會會員大會止。

會上通過 2019-2020 年度的周年報告、核數報告及 2020-2021 年度工作計劃及財政預算。2019-2020 年度的周年報告及核數報告亦在周年大會通過後，以電郵方式寄發予本會助養者及存放於本會網頁上讓公眾查閱。

由於香港社會服務聯會的「WiseGiving 惠施・慈善機構」不再接受申請，會上亦通過將尋求申請成為香港社會服務聯會（社聯）會員，惟申請成為社聯成員需有其他會員機構推薦，故此仍需時間推進此項工作。

本會亦繼續委任並感謝陳何會計師事務所為本會義務核數師；Dr Tomas Zatel 為本會仰光聯絡人、查天凱先生為曼德勒聯絡人，以及查菊英女士為臘戍聯絡人。

財務

本會 2020 年全年經審核的帳目詳見財政報告，全年總收入為港幣 596,856 元；支出為港幣 699,928 元，全年總虧損為港幣 103,072 元。連同滾存的盈餘，本會截至 2021 年 1 月 1 日的總結餘為港幣 105,429 元，此結餘有大部份為助養者在期間一次過捐助全年的助養費。

本會的行政費開支一直維持在極低水平，是年度行政費為港幣 10,811 元，佔總支出約 1.54%，其中超過九成為 PayPal 收取的信用咭平台行政手續費。

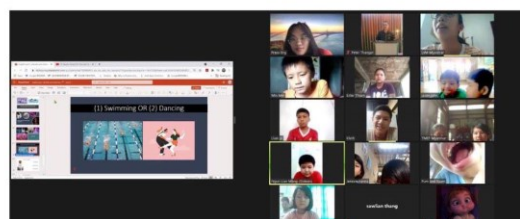
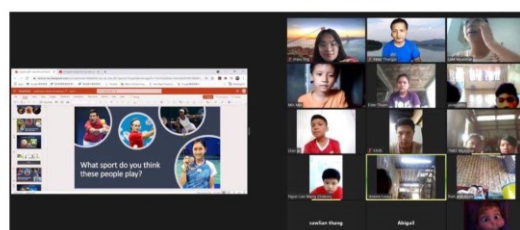
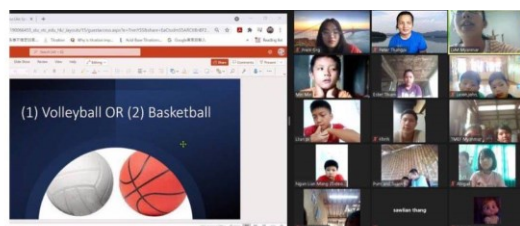
助養者及捐款者現時可透過支票或信用卡形式將捐款給予本會，信用卡捐款是透過 PayPal 收取，當中牽涉高昂的行政手續費（約為捐款的 5.5%），自 2019 年起我們開始以手機轉帳程式 PayMe 及 FPS 轉數快形式收取捐款，以減低手續費開支，同時能便利助養者及減少行政工作。

本會自 2021 年 6 月起加入網上錢包 AliPayHK 的慈善機構名單，公眾人士亦可使用 AliPayHK 捐款給本會。AliPayHK 從中收取 1.7%手續費後將捐款直接存入本會戶口，捐款者可透過平台要求本會發放年度捐款免稅收據。



總結及前瞻

在過去一年多全球深受 2019 冠狀病毒疫情的影響，本會的捐款數字亦減少三成，相信在未來一年情況不會有太大改善。緬甸在疫情和軍事政變雙重打擊下，不單經濟受嚴重影響，人民生活亦大不如前。我們了解到助養者人數及捐款會因經濟環境改變而有所減少，但我們承諾只要機構的財政狀況容許，受惠兒童數目在來年不會減少，我們亦會更積極與緬甸及關心緬甸不同的慈善及非牟利團體合作，共同對抗疫情，並為當地學校、社區投入更多資源，讓兒童、青少年及社區民眾能有更好的學習及居住環境。

Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of LXM Limited set out on pages 6 to 16 which comprise the statement of financial position as at 31 December 2020, the statement of profit or loss and other comprehensive income, the statement of changes in equity and the statement of cash flows for the for the year ended 31 December 2020, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies.

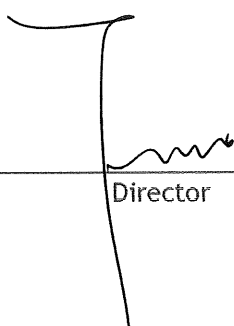

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

1. GENERAL

LXM Limited (“the Company”) is incorporated in Hong Kong under the Hong Kong Companies Ordinance (“Company Ordinance”) on 22 September 2015 as a Company limited by guarantee. The address of its registered office is at Unit 9, 29/F., Metropole Square, 2 Yiu On Street, Shek Mun, Shatin, New Territories.

Under the provisions of the Company’s Memorandum and Articles of Association, every member shall, in the event of the Company being wound up, contribute to the assets of the Company to the extent of HK\$100. At the end of reporting year, the Company had five members.

The Company is a charitable organization and promotes the education and personal development of the people in Myanmar on a non-profit making basis. The Company is confirmed with effect from 9 November 2015 being a charitable institution of a public character, is exempt from tax under Section 88 of the Inland Revenue Ordinance.

2. ADOPTION OF HONG KONG FINANCIAL REPORTING STANDARDS (“HKFRSs”)

(a) Early adoption of new/revised HKFRSs

In the current year, the Company has early adopted all of the new and revised Hong Kong Financial Reporting Standards (“HKFRSs”), which collective term included all applicable individual HKFRSs, Hong Kong Accounting Standards (“HKASs”) and Interpretations issued by the Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants (“HKICPA”) that are relevant to its operations and effective for the current accounting period of the Company. The adoption of these new/revised HKFRSs did not result in substantial changes to the Company’s accounting policies.

(b) New/revised HKFRSs that have been issued but are not yet effective

The HKICPA has issued a number of new/revised HKFRSs that are not yet effective and the Company has not early adopted. The Company is in the process of making an assessment of the potential impact of these pronouncements on their initial adoption.

3. BASIS OF PREPARATION

(a) Statement of compliance

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with all applicable HKFRSs, Hong Kong Accounting Standards (“HKASs”) and Interpretations (hereinafter collectively referred to as the “HKFRSs”) and the disclosure requirements of Hong Kong Companies Ordinance.

(b) Basis of measurement

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost basis.

(c) Functional and presentation currency

The financial statements are presented in Hong Kong dollars (“HK\$”) which is the same as the functional currency of the Company.

4. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

(a) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprise cash at bank and on hand, demand deposits with banks and other financial institutions, and short-term, highly liquid investments that are readily convertible into known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of change in value, having been within three months of maturity at acquisition.

(b) Leasing

Leases that do not transfer substantially all the risks and rewards of ownership to the Company are classified as operating leases. The total rentals payable under the operating leases are recognised to the income and expenditure statement on a straight-line basis over the lease term. Lease incentives received are recognised as an integrated part of the total rental expense, over the term of the lease.

4. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES - Continued

(c) Revenue recognition

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable. Provided it is probable that the economic benefits will flow to the Company and the revenue and costs, if applicable, can be measured reliably, revenue is recognized in the surplus or loss as follows:

Charity sales and donations are recognized in time when the Company becomes entitled to the donations and it is probable that they will be received, which is generally upon the receipt of cash. Any surplus of receipts over expenditure on the Company's activities are classified as accounts payable under current liabilities if refundable to respective donors and reserve funds if repayment is not required by donors.

Interest income is accrued on a time basis on the principal outstanding at the applicable interest rate.

(d) Foreign currencies

Foreign currency transactions during the reporting period are translated at the foreign exchange rates ruling at the transaction dates. Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies and non-monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies that are stated at fair value are translated at the foreign exchange rates ruling at the end of the reporting period. Exchange gains and losses are recognised in surplus or deficit.

(e) Provisions and contingent liabilities

Provisions are recognised for liabilities of uncertain timing or amount when the Company has a legal or constructive obligation arising as a result of a past event, which will probably result in an outflow of economic benefits that can be reasonably estimated.

Where it is not probable that an outflow of economic benefits will be required, or the amount cannot be estimated reliably, the obligation is disclosed as a contingent liability, unless the probability of outflow of economic benefits is remote. Possible obligations, the existence of which will only be confirmed by the occurrence or non-occurrence of one or more future events, are also disclosed as contingent liabilities unless the probability of outflow of economic benefits is remote.

(e) Related parties

- (a) A person or a close member of that person's family is related to the Company if that person:
 - (i) has control or joint control over the Company;
 - (ii) has significant influence over the Company; or
 - (iii) is a member of key management personnel of the Company or the Company's parent.
- (b) An entity is related to the Company if any of the following conditions apply:
 - (i) The entity and the Company are members of the same group (which means that each parent, subsidiary and fellow subsidiary is related to the others).
 - (ii) One entity is an associate or joint venture of the other entity (or an associate or joint venture of a member of a group of which the other entity is a member).
 - (iii) Both entities are joint ventures of the same third party.
 - (iv) One entity is a joint venture of a third entity and the other entity is an associate of the third entity.
 - (v) The entity is a post-employment benefit plan for the benefit of the employees of the Company or an entity related to the Company.
 - (vi) The entity is controlled or jointly controlled by a person identified in (a).
 - (vii) A person identified in (a)(i) has significant influence over the entity or is a member of key management personnel of the entity (or of a parent of the entity).

9. FINANCIAL RISK MANAGEMENT

The main risks arising from the Company's financial instruments in the normal course of the Company's business is liquidity risk, credit risk, interest rate risk and currency risk. These risks are limited by the Company's financial management policies and practices described below:

(a) Liquidity risk

The Company's policy is to regularly monitor current and expected liquidity requirements to ensure that it maintains sufficient reserves of cash to meet its liquidity requirements in the short and longer term.

(b) Credit risk

The Company is exposed to concentration of credit risk on bank balances. The credit risk on liquid funds is limited because the counterparty is a bank with high credit rating assigned by international credit rating agencies.

(c) Interest rate risk

At the end of the reporting period, the Company did not hold any financial assets or liabilities which are exposed to significant interest rate risk.

(b) Currency risk

The Company's operations are principally conducted in Hong Kong and has limited exposure to currency risks which arise from foreign currency receipts and payments for programmes implemented in overseas.

10. APPROVAL OF FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

The financial statements were approved and authorised for issue by the board of directors on 18 September 2021.

Introduction

At the beginning of 2015, LxM was formed by a group of friends who have aspirations for children, education and charity work in Myanmar, and who have visited and served in Myanmar. With the efforts of all parties, LxM was approved by the Inland Revenue Department of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region Government in December 2015 to become a tax-exempt charitable organization under Article 88 of the Inland Revenue Ordinance.

Therefore, in 2016, LxM officially promoted different fundraising and caring activities and campaigns in Hong Kong and Myanmar, in the name of a charitable organization, so that communities in Hong Kong and in different parts of the world can care about children, education and social welfare affairs in Myanmar through different ways. This has upheld the founding purpose of our association:

Love *for* Myanmar
Learn *from* Myanmar
Link *to* Myanmar



Since our establishment, we inherited the “Myanmar Children Sponsorship Programme”, which was launched by the Church of Christ In China Shatin Church in 2010. We work closely and continuously with our partner organization, “Grace Heaven” to care about the orphans in Myanmar and children with poor families. Moreover, LxM's work in Hong Kong and Myanmar has been widely recognized by various parties. In these few years, we were invited by several local universities to sharing our experiences. We are also commissioned by the universities and colleges to organize service groups. Moreover, the Civil Affairs Bureau and the Youth Development Committee of the HKSAR Government have also sponsored us to organize service trips in Myanmar through The Funding Scheme for International Youth Exchange Programme for the second consecutive year.

Preface

It is believed that we all had an unusual time last year, especially for people in Myanmar who was living a hard life. Although the COVID-19 pandemic was not raging Myanmar in 2020, the local economy was still hit badly due to the halt of global tourism and air transportation. Also, we couldn't send volunteers or hold service tours like before. Situation has become even more severe in 2021. The military coup has overthrown the elected government, and turbulence continued in the country. Life of citizens suffered a great change, even our daily online contacts and remittances with our partners are affected.

Nevertheless, we did not stop, nor did we give up supporting Myanmar's education and community needs. Even though some of the work could not be carried out as effectively as in the past, our association has taken this opportunity to unite more caring and willing donors, institutions, and volunteers to generate creative ideas at this difficult time and started our new online teaching programmes. We also raised funds to purchase computers for multiple student centers, so that children in Myanmar can keep learning despite class suspension.

To use resources more effectively, the board of directors decided in 2020 to stop the "Myanmar University Student Scholarship Programme" which had been in operation for four years. Last year's award-winning students were all graduating students or were notified that the scholarship would only be issued for one year.

Although the epidemic and the coup have hindered normal exchanges between the two places, more young Hong Kong university students can now serve



Myanmar children and understand the local needs through online teaching, which was totally beyond our imagination. We would like to thank every sponsor, donor, and volunteer, for walking with us when Myanmar is most in need.

In the future year, we hope that we can continue to uphold the original intention, regardless of religion, ethnic group, skin color and language. We will continue to care about the needs of different communities in Myanmar.

Myanmar Children Sponsorship Programme

The "Myanmar Children Sponsorship Programme" was first launched in 2010 in the Sha Tin Church of the Church of Christ in China. It supports children and teenagers in the Myanmar Grace Haven Orphanage and student centres through monthly sponsorship.

By June 2020, a total of 128 sponsors was supporting 137 boarding children and teenagers from the Student Centers under Myanmar Grace Haven, in Yangon, Lashio, Mei Hang, Gong Ka, Centre for Miao People, Xiang Hai, in addition to Khuahrang Village and Naung Hkio En Xin School and Student Centre. The donation for supporting each child is HK\$265 per month or HK\$3,000 per year. The number of supporters is the same as last year.

At present, sponsors can choose credit card monthly autopay donations or one-off donations for the year.



Due to the pandemic this year, the air postage was suspended so we send sponsored children's letters to sponsors digitally, and we also invite them to send Christmas blessings and greetings to the sponsored children.

The partner of the "Myanmar Children Sponsorship Programme", "Grace Haven", was founded in 1991 by Pastor Cha Tin Yu and Ms Cheng Mao Lan in Lashio, a city in northern Myanmar. At the beginning, there was just a house. But over more than 20 years of development, it has taken care of more than 1,000 children from different parts of Myanmar, and of different races. The children are either orphans or children whose families are unable to take care of them. The Grace Haven is responsible for food, clothing, housing, school, books and medical expenses of the children.

Follow-up sharing by the Myanmar Service Group

☞ [Online Sharing Session] From December 2019 to January 2020, our association organized the "Glue to the Culture" in Myanmar, which was a Culture and Service In-Depth Tour. The sharing session of the event was originally scheduled to be held in March 2020. Due to the epidemic, it was postponed to July 2020 in the form of an online session. The members have also produced a number of themed short videos to share with the public their insights and reflections gained during the journey.

Computers purchasing and online teaching

The outbreak of epidemic in Myanmar has fluctuated since mid-2020. Primary and secondary schools have suspended classes discontinuously after the start of the new semester in June. Children and adolescents from different student

centers and partner organizations are facing the problem of learning pauses. Therefore, our association started a fundraising activity at the end of 2020, and finally purchased 22 computers for different units, and set up accounts for online teaching platform Zoom for some units. The beneficiaries of the 22 computers include:

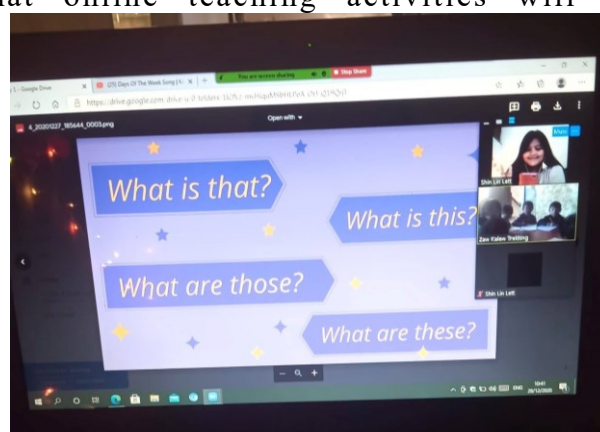
- Lashio Grace Heaven - 7 laptops
- Yangon Lighthouse - 2 desktop computers
- Northern Myanmar Christian College - 10 desktop computers
- Thazi Student Center in Southern Shan State - 2 desktop computers
- Yangon Mercy Student Center - 1 laptop

Since January 2021, LxM has cooperated with a number of local tertiary institutions, and the institutions regularly arrange online English lessons for children in Yangon, Lashio and Chin State. Although teaching can only be carried out through Zoom, and one hour per lesson, the local children are very attentive in class, and they actively jot notes. In addition to Hong Kong university students, we have also gathered volunteers who have travelled to Myanmar, as well as the Myanmar scholarship winners to serve as volunteer mentors to teach English to children in Grace House and Kanbani Village, a remote village of Kalaw in southern Shan State.

The cooperating local tertiary institutions include:

- Hong Kong Institute of Higher Education Technology
- School of Professional and Continuing Education, Hong Kong Polytechnic University
- Hong Kong Baptist University

In response to another large-scale outbreak in Myanmar in July 2021, we expect that online teaching activities will



continue for some time.

Epidemic Support

In response to the increasing seriousness of the epidemic in Myanmar in 2021, LxM specially ordered cloth masks made by disabled people from Pann Nann Ein, a social enterprise in Yangon, to gift to children in remote Chin State.

Community Development and Humanitarian Assistance Projects

☞ [Fundraising for School Expansion] The En Xin School in Naunghkio, Shan State, is a partner we support. In addition to the sponsorship program, we have also brought Hong Kong university student volunteers to serve there. The school needed classroom expansions at the end of 2020 due to the increase in students but faced the problem of insufficient funding. LxM supported part of the construction funding so that local children who were escaping from the war could have a better learning space.

☞ [Clothing Delivery] At the beginning of 2021, some manufacturers donated a batch of brand-new old-version school uniforms and sports uniforms. We decided to ship some of them to remote rural areas in Myanmar, including villages, student centers and refugee camps in Taunggyi, Chin State and Rakhine State. The uniforms, weighing about 110kg, arrived in Myanmar in



April and were distributed with the assistance of local volunteers.

- ☞ [Support IDP in Rakhine State] Due to the epidemic and civil war in Rakhine State, Myanmar, families have been displaced (IDP, Internally Displaced People). Our partners assisted 33 families living in a camp in Mimbya, Rakhine State, as some families had no food. we purchased grain, oil, rice and food for them many times to relieve their urgent need.
- ☞ [Rebuilding school roofs and building toilets] The school in Kawkareik Town, Kayin State, was in urgent need of reconstruction due to the roof being destroyed by strong winds. At the same time, due to the civil war, the number of school attendants in the town's school has soared, leading to the insufficiency of the school toilets. Our association decided to grant fundings for the school to rebuild the roof and to build toilets.



Year-round

Public sharing and media activities

From time to time, LxM is invited to different organizations and gatherings to conduct sharing and fundraising activities. We are also invited by the media to conduct interviews, in order to let the public know more about the latest situation and our work in Myanmar.

- ☞ [Global Experiences at Home] In October 2020, LxM was invited by the Student Affairs Office of the School of Professional and Continuing Education, The Hong Kong Polytechnic University, to share "Ideal Loss and Educational Crisis in Myanmar" online. Therefore, students of the Polytechnic University could gain "Global Experiences at Home" to understand the current educational situation in Myanmar.

☞ [Global Hero Action] In January 2021, Voltra invited us to participate in the Jockey Club Global Hero Action (Social Innovation and Cultivation-International) and shared online with young people from Hong Kong and all over the world about LxM's work in Myanmar over the years, especially the participation since the epidemic started.

☞ [Internet Sharing] Online radio Reading Addiction invited LxM to share our charity work in Myanmar over the years in March 2021. We also talked about the observation of the recent protests in Myanmar.

☞ [Sharing about Social Innovation in Myanmar] In April 2021, the I.CARE Centre for Whole-person Development of the Chinese University of Hong Kong invited one of our co-founders to share online about "Supporting the Disadvantaged with Social Innovation" with the CUHK students. The content centered on the experience of servicing in Myanmar, the experience of establishing a social enterprise and how LxM used Zoom for online teaching during the epidemic.

☞ [Public Fundraising] Starting from June 2021, LxM will be added to the AliPayHK online wallet charity list. In addition to sharing the work of our association, the public can also use AliPayHK to donate to the LxM.



Administrative Affairs

Annual General Meeting

In accordance with the requirements of the constitution, We held our annual general meeting on August 8, 2020, confirming that Mr. Chan Man Hin, Mr. Kong Wai Hin and Mr. Kong Shu Tong will continue to serve as our directors, Ms. Li Wing Man as the voluntary treasurer, and Ms. Chan Suk Yan as the voluntary secretary until the next annual general meeting.

The 2019-2020 annual report, audit report, and the 2020-2021 work plan and financial budget were approved at the meeting. The 2019-2020 annual report and the audit report will also be sent to sponsors by e-mail and uploaded on our website for public inspection after the approval of the annual general meeting.

As the "WiseGiving Charity Organization" of the Hong Kong Council of Social Service no longer accepts applications, the meeting approved seeking to apply to become a member of the Hong Kong Council of Social Service.

LxM will also continue to appoint Chen Ho Certified Accountancy Firm as our voluntary auditors; Dr Tomas Zatel as our Yangon liaison, Mr. Cha Tin Hoi as the Mandalay liaison, and Ms. Cha Kuk Ying as the Lashio liaison.

Finance

The 2020 audited statements of account of LxM are detailed in the financial report. The annual total income is HKD\$596,856; the annual expenditure is HKD\$699,928, and the total annual deficit is HK\$103,072. Together with the accumulated surplus, our aggregate balance by January 1, 2021, is HKD\$105,429. Most of this balance is from the whole-year one-off sponsorships from the donors.

LxM's administrative expenses have been maintained at an extremely low level. The annual administrative fee was HK\$10,811, accounting for approximately 1.54% of the total expenditure, with most of the

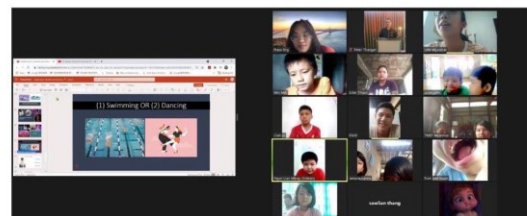
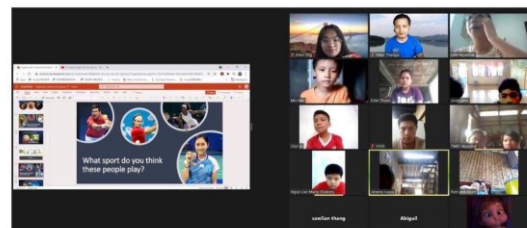
administrative fees being credit card platform administrative charges by PayPal.

Sponsors and donors can now give donations to us by cheques or credit cards. Credit card donations are collected through PayPal, which involves a high administrative fee (about 5.5% of the donation). Since last year, we started using mobile transfer application PayMe and FPS to collect donations in order to reduce administrative fee, while bringing convenience to sponsors and reducing administrative work that has to be done.

LxM has been added to the AliPayHK online wallet charity list since June 2021. The public can also use AliPayHK to donate to our association. After AliPayHK collects a 1.7% handling charge, the donation will be deposited directly into the LxM account. Through the platform, donors can request an annual tax exemption receipt for donations.

Summary and prospects

In the past years, the world has been deeply affected by the COVID-19 pandemic. It is believed that the situation may not improve much in the coming year. Under the double whammy of both the epidemic and the military coup, not only the economy is severely affected, but the living standard of the people is also seriously lowered. We understand that the number of sponsors and donations will decrease due to changes in the economic environment. However, we promise that as long as the financial situation of the organization allows, the number of benefited children will not decrease. We will also actively cooperate with Myanmar and different charitable and non-profit organizations that care about Myanmar, hoping to invest more resources in local schools and communities, so that children, teenagers, and community can have a better learning and living environment.
